Three years Degree course comprises of six (6) semesters. Each semester involves six (6) months only.

IMPORTANT NOTES

1. As per the University Guideline, a student offering any subject as Major shall be required to take one core subject not involving practical to be termed as core-1.
2. For the convenience of the academic and practical purposes, subjects are combined into two groups. They are- (a) Combination of Subjects in Major Course and (b) Combination of Subjects in Non-Major Course.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. H.S. 1ST YEAR (ARTS & COMMERCE)

For admission in to H.S. 1st Year (Arts & Commerce) the students must have passed H.S.L.C. examination conducted by SEBA or examinations conducted by CBSE with a minimum of 50% of marks for the students of General category and 45% of marks for the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC.

2. T.D.C. (B.A.) TOTAL SIX SEMESTERS

A) GENERAL COURSE: For admission to T.D.C. (Six Semester) a student must have passed H.S. Examinations conducted by AHSEC or CBSE with a 45% of marks.

B) MAJOR COURSE: A student who secures 50% of marks in the concerned subject of H.S. Final Examination may apply for Major Course. However, selection will be made in order of merit. Relaxation of 5% of marks is facilitated to SC / ST/ OBC/ MOBC and especially abled candidates.

3. T.D.C. (B.COM) SIXTH SEMESTER

A) GENERAL COURSE: Students must have passed H.S. Examination in Commerce securing at least 40% of marks.

N.B.: As per new guidelines of Dibrugarh University, students from Arts, Science and Commerce may also apply for admission into B.Com Course.



- B) SPECIALITY COURSE:** Cut off marks for admission to B.Com. is 40%. Relaxation of 3% of marks is facilitated to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC and physically differently abler candidates.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ▶ Candidates seeking admission to any H.S. and T.D.C. course at Bihpuria College during the academic session 2017-18 may obtain the prescribed Application form along with the prospectus from the office of Bihpuria College on cash payment of Rs. 100/- (Rupees one hundred only). College prospectus is issued immediately after the announcement of H.S.L.C./H.S. examinations' results.
- ▶ Last date for admission of duly filled-in form for admission in to H.S. and T.D.C. courses will be notified in the College Notice Board.
- ▶ After a proper scrutiny of forms, list of selected candidates to all courses shall be displayed on the Notice Board. No information to the selected candidates will be sent by post.
- ▶ Dates of Admission in to various courses will be notified by the college authority in the Notice Board.
- ▶ Admission to the college in any of the programmes and hostel is strictly on merit basis and subject to approval of the Principal. There is reservation for the students belonging to the category of SC, ST, OBC and MOBC.



RESERVATION OF SEATS ON OTHER GROUND

A limited number of seats are reserved in each subject for especially abled candidates, but deserving candidates must be recommended by the Academic Council of Bihpuria College.

Preference is given to the best performers in Games and Sports and Co-curricular activities in the District, State and National level.

GENERAL GUIDELINES RELATING TO ADMISSION

1. The student should carefully go through

the prospectus before filling up the admission form.

2. Selected candidates shall be required to be present individually to get their admission on the fixed date.
3. Selected candidate must bring his/her original certificates and mark sheets and other required testimonials on the day of admission.
4. Students, who passed the qualification earlier than the current year, will have to submit a 'Gap Certificate'/Affidavit from a Class-I Gazetted Officer/Notary Public for the entire Gap period showing the



candidate's pre-occupation and non-indulgence in any criminal activities after leaving the last institution attended.

5. All the candidates are required to submit Transfer Certificate/Migration certificate during the time of admission.
6. If a candidate fails to complete the admission formalities by the prescribed date, he/she will automatically forfeit his/her right of admission.
7. If a student fails in H.S. 1st year course or T.D.C. 1st semester examination, he/she may apply for admission along with a fresh application.
8. Admission of a candidate may be cancelled at any time, if information furnished by the candidate at the time of admission is found to be incorrect or that the candidate wrongly admitted due to any reason.
9. A student, who could not appear in the examination due to shortage of attendance, or any other reasons, may get re-admission in the same class of that course in the next academic session.

PROGRAMME REGISTRATION:

- a) The candidates shall have to register themselves to the University at the time of admission clearly mentioning their course/subject combinations.
- b) The students registered by the University as per information provided by the college shall be treated as final. In no circumstance, change of subject combination and switching from major programme to general programme and vice-versa shall be allowed.

ATTENDANCE:

- i) A student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists.

Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons on recommendation of the Head / Director / Coordinator of the Department / Centre on payment of a prescribed fee(s)

- ii) The Principal of the college with recommendation of the Heads of the Departments shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to appear in the End-semester examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfillment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance, and send a copy of the same of the University. In such cases, the student shall have to re-enroll in the relevant course(s) with the next batch.





EXAMINATIONS

HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE

There will be one terminal and one test examination in each year. Final Examinations of H.S. courses are conducted by AHSEC.

N.B.: A student must have 80% of attendance in the regular classes.

T.D.C. COURSE (Six Semesters)

As per Academic Calendar of Dibrugarh University, two sessional examinations and at least two unit tests are conducted by the respective departments of the college for internal assessment before End Semester (Final) Examinations. The relevant dates of such examinations are notified by the concerned departments.

There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End Semester examination in each course during every semester. There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny to the University.

(As per the notification of Dibrugarh University Programme notice, notified vide memo no. DU/DR-A/8-1/11/1534 dated 14-03-2011)

End Semester (Final) examinations are conducted by the University itself.

RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO EXAMINATIONS

1. Students must be regular to their respective classes of any programme. Attendance is primary factor for appearing in the examinations. Students are directed

to refer to the ATTENDANCE section given in the prospectus.

2. Students must appear in the sessional examinations and unit tests of their respective subjects and make successful results, failing of which, students will be debarred from appearing in the End Semester (final) Examinations.
3. It is mandatory for the students of T.D.C. course to take active participation in departmental Seminars/Group Discussions organized by the respective departments from time to time. Failing of which, they will be debarred from appearing in the End Semester (Final) Examinations.
4. Requests, after Non-compliance to above mentioned rules, will not be entertained at any cost.

RULES RELATING TO INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (B.A. & B. COM)

1. The marks allotted for Internal Assessment (20%) in each course shall be based on the following –
 - i) Sessional Examination-I (Written)– 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
 - ii) Sessional Examination-II (Written)– 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
 - iii) Seminar/Group Discussion- 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
 - iv) Attendance- 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
2. The marks of Internal Assessment for Attendance shall be awarded as below:

80% to less than 85%	2
85% to less than 90%	3
90% to less than 95%	4
95% to 100%	5

3. Each sessional examination shall be conducted by the concerned teacher(s) of the course. The students shall have to write the answers in the scripts provided and duly authenticated by the college concerned.
4. There shall be no provision for "repeat"/"betterment" in the sessional examination. If a student misses any sessional examination for unavoidable reasons, the concerned teacher may allow the student to appear in a separate examination at his/her own discretion.
5. The marks of internal assessment secured by a candidate shall be carried over to next legitimate chances.
6. If any student fails to appear in internal assessment, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations of the course(s) concerned.

Apart from these, the following conditions are also considered upon for the award of Marks in Internal Assessment:

- i) Maintenance of discipline and punctuality.
- ii) Wearing of Uniforms.
- iii) Use of Library.
- iv) Participation in co-curricular activities like NSS, Scouts & Guides, Seminars, Debating or Literary & Cultural Activities organized by the college from time to time.

BETTERMENT EXAMINATION

- i) A student shall be entitled to take the "betterment examinations" in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the Sixth Semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth Semester examinations.
- ii) No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examinations.

RESULTS AND PROGRESSION

- a) A candidate shall be declared pass provided he/she secures-
 - i) At least 30% marks in each course in the end-semester examinations.
 - ii) At least 30% marks in each course in aggregate in the in-semester and end-semester examinations.
- b) A candidate shall be declared pass a semester, provided he/she passes all the courses of a semester independently.
- c) The marks of in-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- d) A candidate who fails to appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to sixth semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:



- i) A candidates shall be entitled to a maximum of three consecutive chances to clear a course.
- ii) If any candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the course of the previous semester, the result of the candidate shall be withheld and his/her result shall be announced only after he/she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- e) A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within five (5) years from the date of admission to the first semester of any programme.
- f) Since the semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- g) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the six-semester degree B.A./B.Com programme provided he/she has passed all the semester and in all the courses separately.
- h) The degree shall be offered to each candidate, who has passed the six-semester degree B.A./B.Com programme in the following manner:

General (Non-Major) Programme

Major/Specialty Programme

60% and above marks in aggregate	First Division	60% and above marks major courses in aggregate	First Class
50% and above but Less than 60% marks in aggregate	Second Division	50% and above but less in aggregate	Second Class
30% and above but less than 50% marks in major	Simple pass	30% and above but less than 60% marks in major in aggregate	Simple pass (the same degree shall be treated as general degree for B.A./B.Com. Programme)

A student, who secures 60% and above marks in all courses individually and in all Semesters shall be declared to have passed with first division (in case of the students pursuing General programmes) with distinction or first classes (in case of the students pursuing Major/Specialty programmes) with distinction.





UNIFORM

The students must wear the prescribed Uniform during the college hours. The prescribed Uniform for the students of Bihpuria College is as follows:

For Boys : Black Trouser and White Shirt

For Girls : Girls have two options:

- A) White Blouse with Green bordered Chador and Brown (Muga coloured) Mekhela.
- B) Churidar: Pink coloured Top with white coloured Pant and white coloured Churni.

Sweater : Maroon coloured sweater for both boys and girls.

STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

To maintain discipline and academic atmosphere in the college the following measures are executed in letter and spirit:

- i) Disciplinary actions are taken against students who violate wearing uniform in all college affairs, i.e. during college classes, examinations and festivals.
- ii) The use of mobile phone in the college premise is strictly prohibited during the class hours. Students would be punishable, if caught violating such rule.

- iii) All the students are to receive their college identity cards at the time of admission. Without the identity card, no students will be allowed to enter the college and attend classes.
- iv) All Tobacco products are strictly prohibited inside the college campus.

STUDENTS' CHARTER

For the cognitive development, the students have got their charter that features in the following points:

1. They have the right to take part in the general election of students' union to elect representatives.
2. Students' representation in IQAC mechanism of the College.
3. Students have the right to evaluate teaching-learning situation of the Institution through proper procedure. The college provides necessary formats supplied by the IQAC.
4. Students of the institution may undertake educational tours and excursions in vacations. But it is subject to the prior approval of the concerned heads of the departments of the concerned subjects and also authority of the institution.





5. Students, who have proficiency and are experts in any field, may take in festivals and inter-college competitions and in youth festival of the University as a team.
6. NSS is open for all.
7. Students have the right to lodge complain and put up grievance through student's Grievance Cell relating to their educational, administrative and institutional problems in black and white.
8. Students have the right to approach Career Guidance and Counseling Cell of the institution for necessary guidance relating to their academic career.
9. Students' Representation in Anti-Ragging Cell and Anti-Ragging Squad. Liable to make Ragging free campus.
10. The out-going students can be member of Alumni Association of the college.
11. Finally, students are largely responsible to create friendly teaching-learning situation of the institution.

library has around 11000 (Eleven thousand) books. In addition, there are 6 (Six) nos. of daily Newspapers and 19 (Nineteen) nos. of journals including International and National level regularly subscribed in the library. The Library has digital data-base system using Soul 2.0. The Internet Browsing Retrieval Centre attached to the Library has 11 nos. of computer which provides high speed wi-fi helping students to browse for information and virtual learning. The reading room accommodates about 100 students.

Students can access, read, borrow books from the library. The library welcomes all students and teachers to be regular visitors. Separate library cards are issued for students to access library. They are as follows:

For H.S. students	= 1 card each
For T.D.C. (Non-Major)	= 1 card each
For T.D.C. (Major)	= 2 card each

Books are lent for 15 (Fifteen) days only. Delay in returning books is strictly not encouraged. In case of delay in returning books, a fine of Rs 1/- (One Rupee) per day is realized.

FEE STRUCTURE

Fee structure will be made available after getting proper guidelines from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam.

LIBRARY

The college has got two storied library. It remains open from 9 am to 5 pm during working days. The





DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARIES

Departmental library is another feature to add. Most of the departments have developed libraries for their own use and to acquaint the students to new and latest books of their concerned subjects along with journals and magazines. In addition to this, the college has also a book bank.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The college is providing hostel accommodation for Girls within the college campus. With UGC's financial assistance (IX-Plan) the college has built two stories building for women. The admission to hostel is exclusively on merit. However, there is provision for reservation and special reservation for the students coming from distant places and remote areas as well.

The intake capacity of the hostel is as follows:

Girls Hostel = 40 seats.

2. Late Sayed Fajuddin Ahmed Merit Scholarship:

Annual award of Rs. 1,000 (One thousand only) is offered by Dr. Akhtara Begum, Associate Professor, Dept. of Political Science, to the Topper of the college securing at least 60% of Marks in H.S. Final Examination.

STUDENTS' UNION

Bihpuria College Students' Union (BCSU) is the general body of the students of the College. The Office bearers are elected annually in democratic manner. Irregular students and who fail to attend in semester examinations, unit test and fails in any subjects are debarred from contesting in Bihpuria College Students' Union election.

FIELD WORK AND STUDY TOUR

Bihpuria College conducts/arranges excursion and educational tours for students every year during vacation. EXTENSION EDUCATION ACTIVITIES

Extension Education Centre (EEC) of Bihpuria College conducts short term courses to students under its banner. The courses are chosen and taken by various departments of the college emphasizing on the needs of the present day.
