| <p>The Internal Semester Monitoring Committee (ISMC) at Bihpuria College implemented the guidelines as issued by Dibrugarh University. The committee comprises of the Principal, Vice-Principal, and IQAC Coordinator, with all the Head of Departments (HODs) as members. The ISMC oversees the semester system's functioning during even and odd semesters. Key responsibilities include: conducting general meetings before each semester to monitor and implement University-framed semester plans. The committee also ensures to follow University-approved scheduled timelines and coordinate the preparation of academic calendars, class routines, course plans, curriculum delivery, internal assessments, answer script evaluations, and result notifications. Collecting departmental reports post-sessional examinations, the ISMC submits comprehensive reports on semester system implementation to the zonal semester monitoring committee twice a year (May and November). Overall, the Semester Monitoring Committee plays a vital role in executing semester system plans for holistic development of the college.</p> | |

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

Bihpuria College employs a Centralized Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system to assess student development continuously throughout the academic year. The institution ensures student awareness about the evaluation process through various initiatives, as: Orientation programs held at the beginning of each semester. Teaching plans detailing evaluation procedures. Academic calendars displaying examination dates. Orientation sessions on evaluation process changes through tutorial meetings. Displaying relevant information on college and department notice boards. After each sessional test, class teachers analyze results to calculate pass percentages for each course. The Principal monitors student performance and provides feedback to faculty members. Department-wise review meetings are conducted to discuss performance improvement strategies. The college emphasizes progress monitoring and parent engagement. Teachers send progress reports to parents after each test, advising them to take remedial measures if needed. Parents are encouraged to visit the college for discussions related to their wards' performance and progress as and when necessary. External examinations of three hours duration are conducted at the end of every semester for all theory and practical papers. Students must meet a minimum 75% attendance criteria to be eligible for university examinations. Those with 'backlog' papers can sit for both semester examinations.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Bihpuria College is actively involved in organizing counseling programs for students at the beginning of each academic session. These sessions aim to familiarize students and parents with the college, its academic and extracurricular activities, facilities, and rules. For advanced learners, high-performing students are identified based on internal assessments, university examinations, and classroom involvement. These students are advised to participate in group discussions and technical quizzes to develop analytical and problemsolving abilities and improve presentation skills. They are encouraged to undertake micro-projects to cultivate research orientation and practical awareness. For slow learners, the college implements a counseling process. The Principal interacts with guardians and students during admission to assess their needs and aspirations. A Mentor- Mentee group is created at each department where a group of students are assigned to faculty members for ongoing counseling and monitoring of academic performance. Faculty members regularly communicate with parents about the performance and attendance of slow learners. Departments conduct remedial classes, provide study materials, and offer regular assessments to improve student performance and prevent dropouts. Overall, Bihpuria College demonstrates a proactive approach to student support and development, ensuring that both advanced and slow learners receive appropriate guidance and resources to succeed academically.

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Bihpuria College employs several student-centric methods to facilitate an effective teaching-learning process, utilizing diverse course delivery techniques: 1. Lectures: Traditional classroom sessions led by faculty to impart knowledge. 2. Presentations: Students deliver presentations in class, fostering communication and presentation skills. 3. Tutorials: Small-group sessions for interactive learning and discussion. 4. Experimental Exercises: Hands-on activities and laboratory work to reinforce theoretical learning. 5. Written Assignments: Tasks given to students to develop problem-solving skills and reinforce concepts. 6. Online Resources: Utilization of digital platforms for self-directed learning. 7. Case Studies: Analysis of real-world scenarios to apply theoretical knowledge. 8. Webinars: Virtual seminars for interactive learning and exposure to expert insights.

Experiential learning at Bihpuria College is structured in four stages: sensing, observing, thinking, and doing. Assignments and projects are integrated into the curriculum across departments to enhance mental ability, research capabilities, and participatory skills. Excursions and field visits are organized to augment practical experience and skill development. Challenging assignments, quizzes, debates, and seminars are organized to stimulate intellectual curiosity and critical thinking. Regular seminars and lectures by renowned resource persons are conducted, enabling students to present papers and engage with contemporary issues in their fields of study.

Bihpuria College has been imparting education with ICT enabled tools. The faculty members have been intensively using Information and Communications Technology (ICT) enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning. Out of 44, around 40 faculty members of the college are using ICT tools and resources available in its campus; they are using LCD Projectors, Smart classroom, virtual classroom, Google quiz and e-learning technology. There are 6 ICT enabled classroom, 3 ICT Tools and resources, 1 Smart Classroom and 4 e-Resources and techniques available in the college campus. The existing two Seminar Halls are well-equipped with ICT tools. Such e-Learning centre helps the teachers in developing e-content in different subjects. Around 75% of the both teaching and non-teaching staffs are using ICT techniques in the college. Well-equipped computer laboratory is facilitated by the institution to meet the learning demands of the students. Special lectures and technical talk are also arranged by inviting experts from time to time. Library also offers N-LIST service for e-learning among the students and faculties. General ICT Tools used by the faculties of the college are: Desktop and laptops, Projector, Digital cameras, Printer, Photocopier, tablets, Pen Drive, Scanners, and Microphones.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

For transparency and robustness , a Centralized Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system is adopted by Bihpuria College to ensure ongoing assessment of students' development throughout the academic year. The CIE system encompasses the following activities: 1. Orientation on Evaluation Process: The college conducts orientation programs at the beginning of each semester to familiarize students with the evaluation procedures. 2. Sessional examination Result Analysis and Review Meetings: In each semester, as per the guideline of CIE, each department conducts two sessional examinations. Confidentiality is maintained while setting question papers for sessional examinations. Faculties calculates pass percentages and analyses the result of each course.

3. The institution also continuously evaluates students by conducting class presentation, seminar, group discussion and project field work. 4. Progress Reports and Parents Meetings: Teachers send progress reports to parents after each test, advising them to monitor their wards' performance and take necessary actions. 5. Remedial Classes: Remedial classes are organized for slow learners, absentees, and students engaged in extracurricular activities. These classes help struggling students update their subject knowledge and bridge any gaps in learning. 6. External Examinations: At the end of each semester, external examinations are conducted for all practical papers.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Bihpuria College has created a mechanism for redressal of student's grievances related to internal examinations; such as, assessment, victimization, discrimination, attendance, charging of fees, harassment by classmates or teachers etc. The committee of "Grievance Redressal Cell" (GRC) also keeps a special eye on the grievances related to examinations. Sessional examinations are conducted according to the academic calendar provided by Dibrugarh University. Examination time table is also furnished to the students prior to the commencement of classes. Pattern of examination is given by faculty members in their respective classes. Required transparency is maintained by the departments in declaration of internal assessment marks. The special body of 'Grievance Redressal Cell' comprising the Principal as Chairman and two special members from among the senior teachers who are already member of the Cell are allotted to meet the examination related grievances and take decision on it. Grievance related to university external examinations is passed to address by the chief superintendent, CDC cell, examination department of Dibrugarh University.

Satisfactory performance leads to promotions and financial upgrades under PBAS, following UGC and DHE guidelines. The PBAS has been instrumental in motivating staff, identifying areas for improvement, and ensuring enhanced performance among both teaching and non-teaching members of Bihpuria College. This structured appraisal system fosters continuous professional development and supports the college's commitment to academic excellence and institutional growth.
