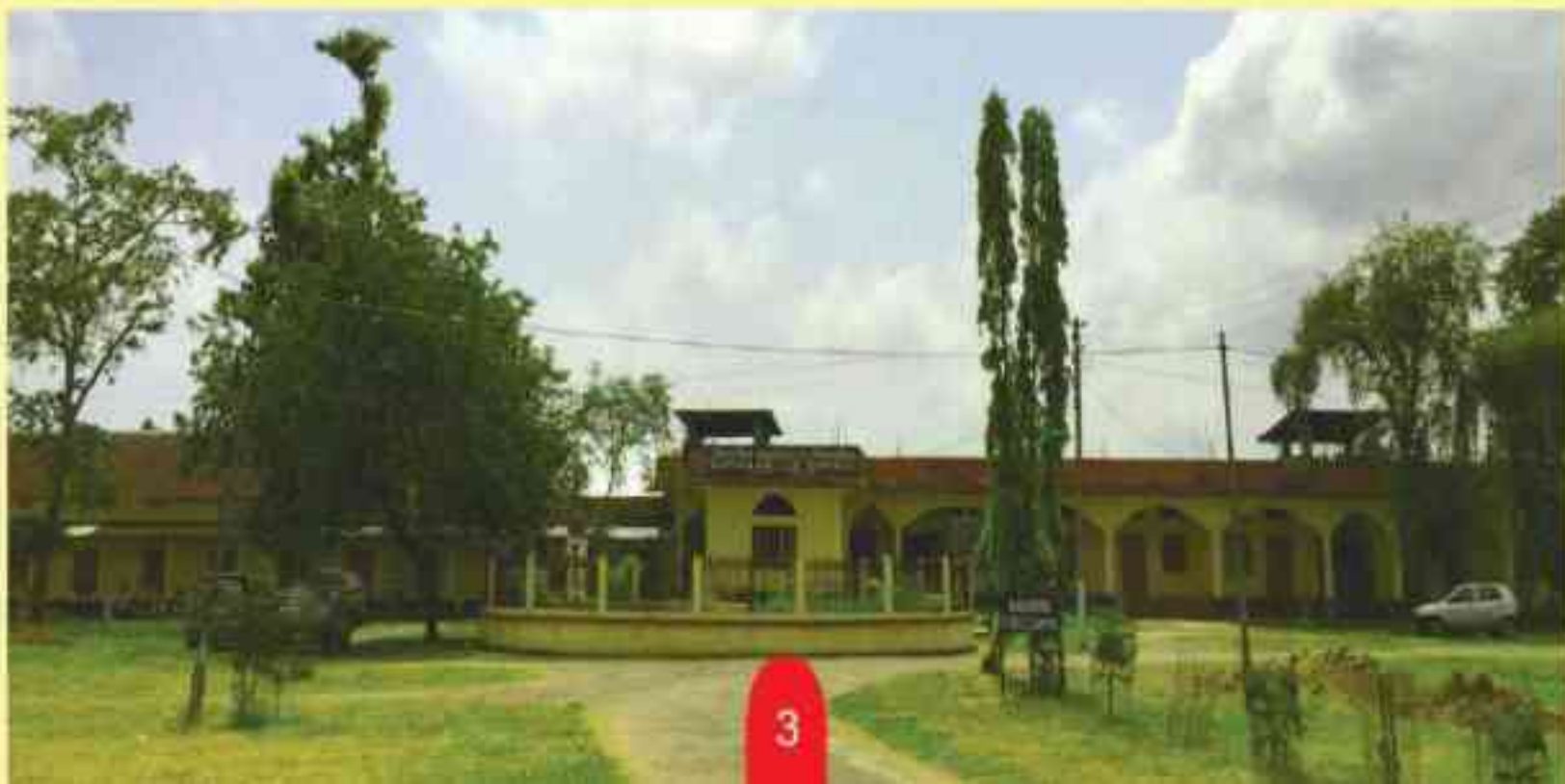

1.2 DETAILS OF HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE IN COMMERCE

SUBJECTS OFFERED

A) COMPULSORY SUBJECTS

English, MIL (Assamese or Alternative English), Accountancy, Business Studies.

B) ELECTIVE SUBJECTS (Any One)

Commercial Arithmetic & Elements of Statistics (CAES), Economics, Salesmanship & Advertising (SAAD), Mathematics.

DETAILS OF B.A. and B.COM PROGRAMME (CBCS)

1.3 The minimum eligibility for admission into the following Programmes:

a) Bachelor of Arts (B.A) : A student passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) of AHSEC or any equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.

b) Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) : A student passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) in Commerce Stream of AHSEC or any equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University in commerce stream. A student passed the H.S. Examination (10+2) in Arts/Science Stream with Mathematics and/or Statistics is also eligible to apply for admission.

2. COURSE STRUCTURE :

2.1 The course structure of the Academic Programme under the CBCS shall be as given below :

a) Core Course : Compulsory components of an Academic Programme. These courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme. The contents of the Core Course is as per the UGC Model Curriculum for the subject /discipline concerned, offered by the affiliating Dibrugarh University.

b) Elective Courses : Elective course shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter-departmental, i.e. Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the Course Structure. These courses shall be :

- supporting to the discipline of study.
- providing the expanded scope.
- enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain.
- nurturing student proficiency/skill.

There shall be a basket of at least eight Elective Courses having equal number of credits. For the students of the same discipline/subjects these elective courses shall be intra-disciplinary and shall be called DSE Courses. If the students of other discipline/subjects (*within the programme*) opt these electives shall be considered as inter-disciplinary and shall be called GE courses.

Further, there may be few courses conducted under the UGC's Programmes on Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC)s. The University may time fix the criteria for MOOCs as per the relevant UGC Guidelines on digital education.

c) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds : 'Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses' and 'Skill Enhancement Courses'. These courses shall be inter-disciplinary (within the programme) in nature. 'AEC' Courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge Enhancement.

3. Attendance

3.1 The course teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.

3.2 All course teachers shall intimate the Principal/Director of a collage/Institute through the Head of the Department concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class day.

3.3 A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination.

Provided that it shall be upon to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/Principals of the Department/Centre/College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

The Principal of the College will announce the names of all students who will not be eligible to take the End-Semester Examinations in the various courses and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates will have to repeat the concerned course(s) when it is offered next.

3.4 A student declared as discollegiate will not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/She will need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/she was declared as discollegiate along with the next fresh batch.

4. Examination & Evaluation

(a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester.

(b) There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for the End-Semester examination in each courses during every semester.

(c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

(d) Internal Assessment :

(i) In internal assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.

(ii) The students will be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend internal assessment including appearing the Sessional Tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-Semester examinations. The department may arrange special in-semester examination wherever necessary.

(e) End Semester Examination :

(i) There shall be one End Semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.

(ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End Semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.

(iii) Normally, the End-semester examination for each course shall be of three hour duration.



(f) Betterment Examination :

(i) A student shall be entitled to take the "betterment examinations" in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the Sixth Semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth Semester examination.

(ii) No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examination.

5. Results and Progression

a) A candidate shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures-

(i) at least 40% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations.

(ii) at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End Semester Examination performance.

(iii) There shall be no separate pass mark for Internal Assessment.

(b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/programme, provided he/she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.

(c) There may be moderation of Internal Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.

(d) The marks of In-semester Examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.

(e) A candidate who fails or does not appear on one or more courses of any end semester examinations upto Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidate will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses.

(f) If a candidate clears the sixth semester

examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/her results shall be announced only after he/she clears the courses of the previous semesters.

A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within Six (6) years from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student, viz. First and Second Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in six consecutive chances. Third and Fourth Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in five consecutive chances and Fifth and Sixth Semester Examination in four consecutive chances.

However, after the first chance of the Fifth and Sixth Semester Examination, the candidate shall be considered as a non-regular candidate.

5. Grading System

(a) The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students.

(b) The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below :

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1.1** Candidates seeking admission to any H.S. and T.D.C. Course at Bihpuria College during the academic session 2019-20 may obtain the prescribed Application form along with the Prospectus downloading from the official site of Bihpuria College (www.bihpuriacollege.edu.in) on payment of Rs.200/- (Rupees two hundred only).
- 1.2** After submission of Admission forms, the candidates have to come personally for verification of their certificates and other necessary documents. Without verification of documents, admission can not be done.
- 1.3** Last date for admission of duly filled-in form for admission in to H.S. and T.D.C. courses will be notified in the College Website and Notice Board of the college.
- 1.4** After a proper scrutiny of forms, list of selected candidates to all courses shall be displayed on the Notice Board of the college and the website. No information to the selected candidates will be sent by post.
- 1.5** Dates of admission in to various courses will be notified by the college authority in the Notice Board and website.
- 1.6** Admission to the college in any of the programmes and hostel is strictly on merit basis and subject to approval to the Principal. There is reservation for the students belonging to the category of SC, ST, OBC and MOBC

RESERVATION OF SEATS ON OTHER GROUND

Reservation of seats will be as according to the rules of Reservation Policy, Govt. of Assam.

A limited number of seats are reserved in each subject for especially abled candidates, but deserving candidates must be recommended by the Academic Council of Bihpuria College.

Preference is given to the best performers in Games and Sports and Co-curricular activities in the District, State and National level.

GENERAL GUIDELINES RELATING TO ADMISSION

1. The student should carefully go through the prospectus before filling up the admission form.

2. Candidates shall be required to be present individually to get their certificates and other necessary documents verified on the mentioned dates.

3. Selected candidates must bring his/her original certificates and mark sheets and other required testimonials on the day of verification.

4. Students, who passed the qualification earlier than the current year, will have to submit a 'Gap Certificate'/Affidavit from a Class-I Gazetted Officer/Notary Public for the entire Gap period showing the



Candidate's pre-occupation and non-indulgence in any criminal activities after leaving the last institution attended.

5. All the candidates are required to submit Transfer Certificate/Migration Certificate during the time of admission.

6. If a candidate fails to complete the admission formalities by the prescribed date, he/she will automatically forfeit his/her right of admission.

7. If a student fails in H.S. 1st year course, he/she may apply for admission along with a fresh application.

8. Admission of a candidate may be cancelled at any time, if information furnished by the candidate at the time of admission is found to be incorrect or that the candidate wrongly admitted due to any reason.

9. A student, who could not appear in the examination due to shortage of attendance, or any other reasons, may get re-admission in the same class of that course in the next academic session.

PROGRAMME REGISTRATION :

a) The candidates shall have to register themselves to the University at the time of admission clearly mentioning their course/subject combinations.

b) The students registered by the University as per information provided by the college shall be treated as final. In no circumstance, change of subject combination and switching from major programme and vice-versa shall be allowed.



UNIFORM

The students must wear the prescribed Uniform during the college hours. The prescribed Uniform for the students of Bihpuria College is as follows :

For Boys : Black Trouser and White Shirt.

For Girls : Girls have two options :

A) White Blouse with Green Bordered Chador and Brown (Muga Coloured) Mekhela.

B) Churidar : Pink coloured Top with white coloured pant and white coloured Churni.

Sweater : Maroon coloured sweater for both boys and girls.

STUDENT'S CODE OF CONDUCT

To maintain discipline and academic atmosphere in the college, the following measures are executed in letter and spirit :

i) Disciplinary actions are taken against students who violate wearing uniform in all college affairs, i.e. during college classes, examinations and festivals.

ii) The use of mobile phone in the college premise is strictly prohibited during the class hours. Students would be punishable, if caught violating such rule.

iii) All the students are to receive their College Identity Cards at the time of admission. Without the Identity Card, no students will be allowed to enter the college and attend classes.

iv) All tobacco products are strictly prohibited inside the college campus.

STUDENTS' CHARTER

For the cognitive development, the students have got their charter that features in the following points :

1. They have the right to take part in the general election of students' union to elect representatives.

2. Students' representation in IQAC mechanism of the College.

3. Students have the right to evaluate teaching-learning situation of the institution through proper procedure. The college provides necessary formats supplied by the IQAC.

4. Students of the institution may undertake Educational Tours and Excursions in vacations. But it is subject to the prior approval of the concerned Heads of the Departments of the concerned subjects and also authority of the institution.





5. Students, who have proficiency and are experts in any field, may take in festivals and inter-college competitions and in youth festival of the University as team.

6. NSS is open for all.

7. Students have the right to lodge complain and put up grievance through student's Grievance Cell relating to their educational, administrative and institutional problems in black and white.

8. Students have the right to approach Career Guidance and Counseling Cell of the institution for necessary guidance relation to their academic career.

9. Student's Representation in Anti-Ragging Cell and Anti-Ragging Squad liable to make Ragging Free campus.

10. The out-going students can be member of Alumni Association of the college.

11. Finally, students are largely responsible to create friendly teaching-learning situation of the institution.

the Library. The Library has digital data-base system using soul 2.0. The Internet Browsing Retrieval Centre attached to the Library has 11 nos. of Computer which provides high-speed WIFI helping students to browse for information and virtual learning. The reading room accommodates about 100 students.

Students can access, read, borrow books from the Library. The Library welcomes all students and teachers to be regular visitors. Separate Library Cards are issued for student to access Library. They are as follows :

For H.S. students = 1 Card each

For T.D.C. (Non-Major) = 1 Card each

For T.D.C. (Major) = 2 Card each.

Books are lent for 15 (Fifteen) days only. Delay in returning books is strictly not encouraged. In case of delay in returning books, a fine of Rs.1/- (one rupees) per day is realized.

FEE STRUCTURE

Fee structure will be made available after getting proper guidelines from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam.

*However, a student has to pay Rs. 79/- for Identity Card (Admissible for free admission also).

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

LIBRARY

The college has got two storied Library. It remains open from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. during working days. The Library has around 11000 (eleven thousand) books. In addition, there are 6 (six) nos. of daily Newspapers and 19 (nineteen) nos. of journals including International and National level regularly subscribed in



DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARIES

Departmental Library is another feature to add. Most of the departments have developed Libraries for their own use and to acquaint the students to new and latest books of their concerned subjects along with journals and magazines. In addition to this, the college has also a Book Bank.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The college is providing hostel accommodation for girls within the college campus. With UGC's financial assistance (IX-Plan) the college has built two stories building for women. The admission to hostel is exclusively on merit. However, there is provision for reservation and special reservation for the students coming from distant places and remote areas as well.

The intake capacity of the hostel is as follows:

Girls Hostel = 40 Seats

STUDENTS' UNION :

Irregular students and who fail to attend in semester examinations, unit test and fails in any subjects are debarred from contesting in Bihpuria College Students' Union Election.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL

The Counselling Cell of this college keeps itself ready and up to date with information for academic and vocational pursuance in case of a student. The cell provides instruction and advice both departmentally and centrally and also at the individual level as and when necessary regarding academic and other career related matters.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college has been formed to have an eye on the total milieu of the college in respect to academic and functional development. It tries to make a comprehensive assessment of all academic matters, and on the basis of such assessment, remedial measures are taken by the authority in co-ordination with the IQAC.

In the present era UGC has given emphasize on extension activities of the college, so as to provide the students extra-curricular activities to enrich their knowledge both theoretical and practical. The college also organizes symposiums, seminars and workshops on various relevant topics with a view to providing extra skills, knowledge and capability of the students. Apart from this the college frequently organizes social awareness programmes and camps to generate much awareness such as AIDS awareness and Environmental awareness programme, Blood Donation Camp etc.





ICT CELL

ICT Cell of Bihpuria College is imparting Certificates in Computer Education. It has got a separate technically advanced laboratory with Internet facility. The college is on the process to introduce WiFi facility in its campus.

NCC

NCC is an important organization of the college engaged in conducting constructing activities and making its cadets disciplined and devoted citizens. Students has the option to opt for NCC during their course of study. By joining NCC they can appear in 'B' and 'C' certificate examination. The college has strength of 50 cadets.

ADOPTION OF MODEL VILLAGE AND MODEL SCHOOL

Model village and model School are some of the innovative projects of the college being undertaken from this year, 2015. Under these, Dongibil Christian Village has been adopted as Model Village and 'Shankardev Adarsha Vidyapith High School', Kholaguri as Model School by the college family.
